FIRE PREVENTION

Traditionally, the month of October is a busy time for every fire department, as this is National Fire Safety Month.

This year, the message was "Every Second Counts". The messages focused on Home Fire Drills, Get Out / Stay Out, Close Doors Behind You, and ensuring exits are clearly marked. While these things may seem simple, they can help to make sure that both you and your family are safe in the event of a fire in your home.

During the month of October, YAUFR crews performed Fire Extinguisher Training for nearly 750 people, and saw another 1,500 people during the course of Public Education visits. When added to the nearly 350 calls for emergency service and countless internal training hours, October was a busy month!

As always, please remember to check the batteries in your detectors as well. We always suggest changing the batteries in your detectors when you change your clocks for daylight savings time in the spring and fall.

Should you find that your alarm is out of date, they can be purchased at any hardware store. If you need assistance with installation, obtaining a detector, or if you have any other questions relating to smoke detectors or fire safety - please contact our office at 717-718-2381. Our department recently completed our "Fall Burn" live fire training sessions at the York County Fire School.

These sessions focused on "Side C" (rear of the structure) duties. Our structure fire "Standard Operating Procedure" provides directions to our crews on where to go and what tasks to expect to perform based upon the order of their arrival. This helps to ensure a coordinated attack on the fire, and allow for a standardized approach to an inherently dangerous situation. During all live fire training sessions, our crews are able to practice skills in a realistic heat and smoke environment.
