1. CALL TO ORDER

A. Opening Ceremony

1. Pledge of Allegiance

HUNT Chairman Hunt called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance. He stated that the meeting would begin with the swearing in of some new officers.

Chief Hoff indicated that one of the things they love to do is to recognize great effort from YAUFR's people.

HUNT Chairman Hunt provided the Oath of Office to Curvin Wolfgang for the Office of Battalion Chief and to Captain Matthew Brown for the duties of Fire Captain.

HOFF Chief Hoff presented additional awards as follows:

- 20 Years of Service Clyde Beaver
- Battalion Chief's Award Firefighter Nick Wilcox. He was presented with a Certificate and a Leadership Coin.
- Fire Chief's Award Captain Todd Hileman. He was presented with a Chief's Awards Bar and Certificate.
- Fire Chief's Commendation Firefighter Aaron Eckert

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HUNT

Chairman Hunt brought forward the potential for creating a Pension Investment Policy Subcommittee. This Subcommittee would include the two Firefighters that are on the Pension Board. He mentioned the Actuarial Assumption which continues to fall short of its target. He would like to have one or two board members and a Firefighter representative who is eligible for the Defined Benefit.

WURSTER

Mr. Wurster questioned the scope of the work of the Subcommittee along with the deliverables.

HUNT

Chairman Hunt responded that the scope would assess, in broad terms, the current Investment Policy that Fulton holds itself to; whether or not they are comparable to other similar pension funds. That would include not only the available financial vehicles and the benchmarks and how they are judged.

HOVIS

Solicitor Hovis added that it would include the rate of return assumptions contained within the policy.

WURSTER Mr. Wurster added that there would be a review of the current Investment Policy Statement. He stated he would be happy to serve on the committee.

DVORYAK Mr. Dvoryak mentioned that, as part of his day job, they focus on their endowment for the long term to make sure the strategy and investment policy statement fits what matches up with what they are doing from the investments perspective. He indicated that whatever intelligence he could bring from that, he would be happy to lend to the committee.

RHOADES

Mr. Rhoades indicated he would be willing to serve on the Subcommittee.

WURSTER Mr. Wurster indicated that the three of them would meet following this meeting and determine who would be the Chairman.

HUNT

Chairman Hunt asked Chief Hoff to work with the Subcommittee members and have his office coordinate the dates and provide a room for meetings.

ROONEY

Mr. Rooney questioned what the timeframe might be for a response.

HUNT

Chairman Hunt responded that there should be some sort of presentation to the board before the next quarterly meeting with Fulton.

HUNT

Chairman Hunt added that he had introduced the idea to the Fulton ladies. He was sure they would be willing to share any documentation or insight that they might have.

HUNT Chairman Hunt nominated himself as Chairman; Dan Rooney as Vice Chairman; George Dvoryak as Treasurer and Charles Wurster as Secretary.

MR. DVORYAK MOVED FOR THE NOMINATIONS TO BE CLOSED. MR. WURSTER WAS SECOND. MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

MR. WURSTER MOVED TO APPROVE THE SLATE OF OFFICERS FOR THE YORK AREA UNITED FIRE AND RESCUE COMMISSION WITH CHAIRMAN AUSTIN HUNT, VICE CHAIRMAN DAN ROONEY, TREASURER GEORGE DVORYAK, SECRETARY CHARL ES WURSTER. MR. ROONEY WAS SECOND. MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

Chairman Hunt called for each individual to introduce themselves starting with the Stenographer, Jean Abreght, Solicitor Steve Hovis; also Solicitor for Spring Garden Township; George Dvoryak, Board Representative from Springettsbury Township; Mike Thomas, Board Representative from Spring Garden Township; John Inch, Board Representative from Manchester Township; Charles Wurster, Board Representative from Springettsbury Township, Current Secretary and Subcommittee Investment Committee Member and Banker from York Traditions Bank; Dan Rooney, Board Representative from Spring Garden Township and Debra McCune, Alternate Board Representative from Manchester Township. Finally, Austin Hunt, Chairman and former Commissioner from Spring Garden Township. Alternate Board Representative, Don Bishop from Springettsbury Township.

2. ANNOUNCEMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

HUNT Chairman Hunt announced that there had been no Executive Sessions after the last meeting; however, one was scheduled for following adjournment this date.

3. COMMUNICATION FROM CITIZENS

There were no Citizen Comments.

4. MANAGEMENT/ATTORNEY REPORTS

A. Steve Hovis, Solicitor

HOVIS

Solicitor Hovis complimented the Command Staff, Battalion Chief Woods, who is the Right-To-Know Officer along with Lisa Einsig. There was a unique Right-To-Know Request from Counsel for one of the ex-Firefighters who was fishing on an issue. Filling out the Right-To-Know Request reflected the fact that the Chief's Command Staff followed the procedures that were to be followed when

certain inquiries were being made about employment status. They did a great job and at the end of the day, although they were fishing for something, ultimately the Right-To-Know Request confirmed that everything that was done was done correctly. Well done.

B. Daniel Hoff, Fire Chief

HOFF

Chief Hoff commented that he would like to find an agreeable date when they can continue with orientations. One thing as a possibility is that they have the spring burns at the fire school set for three consecutive Wednesdays in April. If any of the new Commissioners that have not been through that part of the orientation are interested, and that extends to the Alternates as well, they would be more than happy to have them at one of the scheduled burn sessions. Perhaps they can set up another brief session at the fire school in March or April. This would be to go over what YAUFR does from a rescue standpoint.

HUNT

Chairman Hunt commented on his experience at the fire school as stark realities. One was how incredibly professional and well-trained our Firefighters are along with the Esprit de' corps is just amazing. They took him into a live burn, which he found incredibly scary, hot and dark. They go in with their training and personalities and perform well in a very hostile environment. He encouraged everyone from a personal standpoint to experience what firefighting is all about. Also, from a management standpoint interact with the employees for them to see the human side of the board.

HOFF

Chief Hoff noted that Mr. Dvoryak could attest that he got a lot out of it just being there to observe. He indicated that from the employee's standpoint whether he went through every evolution or whether he observed, he was still asking questions. From the employee's standpoint they just appreciated the heck out of the fact that he took an interest in them as your employees.

WINGERT

Ms. Wingert indicated it had been an absolutely eye-opening experience. She truly appreciated the time they took to explain the process to the board before they went in and while they were in there. She said she loved the experience. It was excellent.

HOFF

Chief Hoff stated that he had a response from five people. He is waiting to hear from another five counting the Alternates. He had provided a list of dates for the month of March, but it could be moved forward. He'd really appreciate a response because the fire school fills up quickly. It is the only facility in the county, and there are 60 some stations that are vying for availability. He indicated that April burn dates are April 8, 15 and 22^{nd} .

MR. 7. COMMUNICATION FROM COMMISSIONERS

WURSTER Mr. Wurster commented that he had gone to the website to see when the YAUFR board meetings were scheduled. He did not find it to be very transparent. He wondered if there would be a way to increase the transparency and advertise when the meetings are on the website.

HOFF Chief Hoff stated that there is a calendar on the website that has the meetings listed. The only thing that was not listed on it was the Pension Board meetings. He did agree that the calendar is nothing that jumps out. He agreed to discuss it with the host of the website.

8. COMMITTEE REPORTS

A. Volunteer committee

GRUBBS Mr. Grubbs noted that Chief Hoff might have discussed the activities with the Commission.

HOFF
Chief Hoff indicated that there had been a conversation which was part of the report. They are trying to continue to bring all the volunteer companies together. For a period of time there was a huge push that they themselves needed to merge or consolidate. It would be terrific and makes sense; however, it is obvious by discussing with the individual companies that they are not ready for that. The challenge that Paul Grubbs and he talked about and started a conversation with the group at the last meeting was challenging them to find areas where they can come together. It could be solicitations, fundraising, operational stuff, training, etc. Perhaps they could increase communications as they all suffer with the same problem, i.e., not having enough bodies to fill seats to which they all admitted. Another meeting is scheduled for February 19th which is to keep up the momentum from the last meeting instead of skipping a month. One item that is in the pipeline legislatively regards changes to the Relief Association Act that could help with recruitment and retention. They have begun discussing Federal Grants

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regarding volunteer recruitment and retention. They just need to bring the brain power together to get the wheels in motion.

HUNT Chairman Hunt thanked them for the report. They will look forward to hearing how the Commission can help.

GRUBBS Mr. Grubbs indicated they should have at least some of the results of what they discussed at next month's meeting.

9. RESOLUTIONS AND AGREEMENTS

HOVIS Solicitor Hovis stated that the YAUFR Board is the Pension Board. The Resolution confirms that.

- **HOFF** Chief Hoff stated that he has forms for all the new Commissioners to sign for York Traditions Bank. He asked for everyone to sign the forms before they leave.
- **DVORYAK** Mr. Dvoryak questioned who will serve as the backup issuer for the bill pay service. As Treasurer he will continue to fill that role primarily; however, there is a need for a backup.
- **ROONEY** Mr. Rooney offered to be the backup again. He had not had to perform the task so he would have to review the procedure.
