A. Volunteer Committee

GRUBBS Mr. Grubbs reported he had no report. A meeting will be held September 20, 2023.

9. RESOLUTIONS AND AGREEMENTS

A. Acceptance-York County Planning Commission Opioid Settlement Funding Grant Agreement

HOFF

Chief Hoff stated they submitted various training costs with the Opioid Settlement Grant. Although they received only a portion of the request due to limited funding, they were appreciative to receive the funds to provide additional training. They also received a significant portion of funding to cover overtime for training in the amount of \$15,000.

MR. GWILT MOVED TO ACCEPT THE GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE YORK COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION AND YAUFR REGARDING THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT. MR. SEEBOLD WAS SECOND. MOTION UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED.

10. ACTION ON MINUTES

A. Approval of Minutes – August 15, 2023 - Fire Commission Meeting

MR. DETWILER MOVED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF AUGUST 15, 2023 FOR THE FIRE COMMISSION MEETING AS SUBMITTED. MR. DVORYAK WAS SECOND. MOTION UNANIMOUSLY PASSED.

11. OLD BUSINESS

A. Discussion – Portable Radios Replacement

HOFF

Chief Hoff stated if they take advantage of the pricing available to the end of 2023 it would be a significant savings, noting the cost per radio would be \$3500. He noted they are considering some prospects with 3-year financing of the amount.

In response to a question for the possibility of applying for a grant, Chief Hoff noted any grants applied for now for the radios, would not be known until sometime into 2024 which would be past the window to take advantage of the lowest price.

Chief Hoff reiterated from a safety standpoint mixing models of radios is not an option. He noted he is anticipating a decision to be made at the Commission meeting, whether for financing options or to have the municipalities make a budget amendment to pay for the radios. Depending on the decision the radios could then be ordered by December to take advantage of the lower price.

The number of radios to be ordered would be approximately 160 units. Chief Hoff explained the distribution of the radios.

Chief Hoff stated for the October Commission meeting he would prepare both options for consideration.

12. NEW BUSINESS

A. Acknowledgement – Minimum Municipal Obligation Calculation Sheets for YAUFR/MT Retirement plans

MR. DVORYAK MOVED TO ACCEPT THE FIVE MMO CALCULATION SHEETS AS PROVIDED. MR. DETWILER WAS SECOND. MOTION UNANIMOUSLY PASSED.
